Larry with his wife Carolyn owned and operated Books on First in Dixon since 1998. Larry married Carolyn Chin Feb. 18, 1995 in Chicago. He was preceded in death by his son James. He was also preceded in death by sister Charlene Miles, brothers P.H. Dunphy and Thomas Dunphy and son-in-law Mark Freeman.
