Allen J. Wyrick, age 76, of Amboy, died Tuesday November 30, 2010 in his home. He was born May 10, 1934 in Hartman, AR, the son of Wesley and Ida (Rowland) Wyrick. He had been a laborer for the Dixon Labor Union # 727 for many years prior to his retirement. He was a veteran of the US Army serving during the Korean Conflict. He was a member of the Full Gospel Fellowship Church in Rochelle. He also played guitar and sang in "Big Al and the Night Owls" at local establishments. He married Charlotte Richter at the Full Gospel Fellowship Church in Rochelle October 8, 1988. He was preceded in death by 7 sisters and 1 brother. He is survived by his wife of Amboy; 3 daughters Sam (William) Hurst of Creston, Barbara (Lynn) Hicks, and Jenny (Corey) Dean both of Quincy; son Larry (Vicki) Wyrick of Allen, TX; 7 step-children Ron Hicks, Don Hicks, Lonald Hicks, Patrick Hicks, Tammie Powell, Ralph Sanders, and Tom Sanders; 23 grandchildren; 22 great-grandchildren; 1 sister Hallie Taylor of Arkansas.
