Amey M. Schweik, age 79, of Amboy, and formerly of Lombard, died Friday, February 6, 2015, at Aperion Care in Amboy. She was born December 31, 1935, in Flemingsburg, KY, the daughter of Harlan and Lela (Christa) Phelps. She graduated high school in Flemingsburg, and then later left for training in Chicago to begin a career in the airline industry. She had worked in many fields including Braniff Airlines in the 1960's, a Crossing Guard with the Berkeley Police Dept in the 1970's, and also worked in various office settings with companies such as Itek Corporation, and Bekins Van Lines from the 1970's to the 1990's.

She was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Lombard.

Amey married Edward Schweik in Bellwood, on July 18, 1964. He preceded her in death April 17, 2014. She was also preceded in death by her 5 siblings Hank, Oral, Ronald, Elizabeth, and Betty.
