When she worked at the nursing home across town she would walk to work second shift then walk home after dark ,about 11.30 I would see her flashlight meandering from one side of the road to the other then I could rest knowing she made it home safe. Sometimes I used her flashlight to hunt for nightcrawlers to fish with and run the batteries down on her. She would get so mad ,I guess I was to young to know how much just a little light to walk home with meant. Often in the coldest part of winter she would have a loaf of bread homemade waiting after school and I can still taste how great that was with melted butter right out of the oven.
