David Eugene Fenwick, 63, died on Saturday June 4, 2016, at Aperion Care, Amboy, IL where he was cared for due to cancer. He was born October 3, 1952, in Dixon, IL, the sixth of thirteen children born to Raphael F. and Mary Jane Fenwick. He is a graduate of Sterling High School in 1973. David was employed at Wal-Mart, Dixon, IL for ten and one-half years. Additionally, over the years, he volunteered at local nursing homes.

Having been handicapped since birth, David lived most of his life in a wheelchair, but surmounted his physical condition in different ways such as keeping an apartment, driving his own car, riding a horse, and swimming. In his younger years, David collected stamps. Later in life he enjoyed reading biographies of people from American history and of evangelists and missionaries.

David became aware of his need for a Savior at age 27, and received Jesus Christ into his life at that time. He was baptized in 1995 at First Baptist Church, Amboy, IL. David was an avid reader of the Scriptures and memorized a large number of Scripture verses.

David was preceded in death first by two brothers, Theodore Francis and Charles Edward; then by his Dad, Ray; and brother-in-law, Dick Granstrom. He is survived by his Mom, Jane of Dixon; siblings BJ (Pam) Fenwick of Sterling, Trudy Granstrom of Walworth, WI, Jeanette (Roger) Schinderling of Quincy, Paul (Dr. Audie Klotz) Fenwick of Liverpool, NY, Lucy (Rick) Strub of Dixon, Betsy (Rev. Rob) Iler Alexander City, AL, Joe Fenwick of Amboy, Tim

Fenwick of Mendota, Dr. Margaret "Peg" (Dr. Kevin) Harbol of Bothell, WA, and Rick (Maria Rossoto) Fenwick of Decatur, GA; two generations of numerous nieces and nephews.
