I was saddened to learn of your Mom's death. My memories of her are of a perpetually smiling and upbeat, happy person. I regularly am reminded of your parents who were looking after me once while my Mom and Dad were away from our Artesian Street home on a "day trip." Tom and I were using a toy shotgun to knock acorns off a tree by Oakwood Cemetery. We'd throw the gun upward and catch it and throw it again. As I looked upward to catch the gun, it's double barrel caught me on the left side of my forehead and opened a round crater-like wound. Mr. and Mrs. Mighell had to take me to Dr. Stitzel's to get stitched up (4 or 5 stitches) since my parents were not available. I still on occasion observe the scar when I shave - - and I always too am reminded of your Mom (and Dad's) many kindnesses to me.
