Douglas A. Schimmer, age 85 of Sublette, died Sunday November 29, 2009 at the Mendota Lutheran Home. He was born April 24, 1924 in Sublette the son of Herman and Mary (Longbein) Schimmer. He had been a plumber for Triple Service in Mendota for many years prior to his retirement in 1989. He was a graduate of Amboy High School and served in the US Army during World War II.
