June 3, 1926 - May 11, 2011

Earl J. Nauman 84, of Amboy died Wednesday May 11, 2011 in his home surrounded by his children. He was born on June 3, 1926, in Amboy, the son of Joseph and Lucille (Boehle) Nauman. He was united in marriage to Shirley A. Sheridan on August 19, 1950, at St. Patrick Church, Maytown. Earl and Shirley started their lives in farming in Lee County. In 1984 they became the owners of the Long Branch Saloon, until they retired January 1, 2007. During this time Earl continued farming and he invented the Portable Net Tightening Post Assembly and was granted a patent on April 8, 1990. On December 4, 2002 Earl and Shirley became "Grantors," and developed Nauman Estates in the city of Amboy. Earl and Shirley were devoted to their work in the restaurant and to their patrons and employees. The two things that were important to Earl were his faith and his family. Earl was a Veteran of the US Army during World War II. He was preceded in death by his wife Shirley; infant son James Nauman; granddaughter Lisa Nauman; two sisters Dolores Leffelman, Shirley Full and two brothers Stanley Nauman, and Mervin Nauman.
