



Elmo Miller Litts Jr

December 2, 1930 - October 11, 2015

Elmo M. Litts, age 84, of Amboy, died Sunday, October 11, 2015, at KSB Hospital in Dixon. He was born in Sublette, December 2, 1930, the son of Elmo and Florence (Powell) Litts.

He had worked for Bay Valley Foods in Amboy for 50 years prior to his retirement and also for Spitts Plumbing and Heating.

Elmo was a Veteran of the Air Force during the Korean War from 1950-1954 and also of the Army from 1956-1958. He served as a Texas Ranger for 2 years in the 1950's, was a member of the Teamsters for 50 years, and as a Senior in high school he was voted Amboy's Favorite Son. Elmo was an avid fan of the Dallas Cowboys and the Texas Longhorns.

He married Barbara S. Wall in Amboy August 21, 1976. She preceded him in death November 7, 2009. He was also preceded in death by his parents; 3 brothers Bill, George, and Stanley Litts; 1 sister Elizabeth Kufman.

Survivors include his children Mike (Tonya) Litts of Dixon, Anthony (Sherri) Litts of Harmon, Amy (John) Varga of Harmon, and Debra (Ramon) Olalde of Sterling; step-daughter Teresa Gonzalez of Mendota; 16 grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; numerous nieces and nephews.

Visitation will be held on Wednesday, October 14, 2015 from 4:00 until 8:00 PM in the Mihm-Jones Funeral Home in Amboy with Military Honors by the Amboy American Legion at 8:00 PM.
