Eugene M. "Doc" Koehler 85 Amboy, IL died Wednesday November 9, 2005 in Mendota Community Hospital Mendota, IL He was born Nov. 21, 1919 in Sublette, IL the son of Paul and Bessie (Hicks) Koehler. He was a pharmacist and had owned and operated Koehler Drug Store in Amboy for over 20 years prior to his retirement in 1981. He was a veteran of the US Army during W.W.II.
