Goldie Louise Shull Roller, 94, of Dixon IL, passed away on July 10, 2024 at The Dixon Rehabilitation & Health Care Center, where she had been lovingly cared for by the staff during her one month stay.

Goldie was born to Harry Edward and Marie Meeks Shull in Harrisonburg, Virginia on August 5, 1929. She was a graduate of Harrisonburg HS & Bridgewater College. Goldie was an elementary school teacher at Waterman School in Harrisonburg.
