



## Harold Larue Reinhold

October 12, 1923 - May 14, 2013

Harold L. Reinhold, age 89, of Princeton, and formerly of Amboy, died Tuesday May 14, 2013 at Heartland Healthcare Center in Henry following an illness. He was born October 12, 1933, in Sublette, the son of Alpha Fred and Clara D. (Hansen) Reinhold.

He worked as a shipping and receiving clerk for many different warehouses before retiring in 1985. He was also a Security Guard at Woodhaven Lakes in Sublette.

Harold was a Veteran of the US Army Air Force Thirteenth Division serving in the Pacific Theater during World War II.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister Harriet Holland.
