John S. Frybarger, age 83 of Harmon, died Sunday May 31, 2009 in his home. He was born in Oak Park, Illinois September 1, 1925 the son of Dr. Clarence and Elsie (Meissner) Frybarger. He was a locomotive engineer for the Indiana Harbor Belt Railway from January 25, 1947 until April 1978 when he retired. He was a veteran of the Navy serving during World War II.
