Larry Neil Sutton age 67 of Dixon died Saturday July 8, 2006 at his home with his wife and sister at his side after suffering a series of strokes over the past 10 months. Larry also enjoyed his cats and they spent many hours napping together. After retirement, Larry was a regular at Cathy's Breakfast Nook enjoying " the best coffee in town" and the chit chat. He also spent many Wednesday afternoons at the American Legion Hall. Survivors include his wife, a sister Mary Joan Heckman of Dixon, and 2 nephews Jeff (Samantha) Heckman of Peoria and Chad (Jennifer) Heckman of Tallahassee, FL.
