I moved away last year and haven't talked with your mom much since I left. I spoke with a neighbor last week and asked how "Mrs Green's daughter" was doing (as she was known in the neighborhood) and I was told the ambulance was there the day before. This news came as I had been "thinking about giving her a call" and just kept getting busy with life and I never made the call until it was too late. When I did, she was in the hospital and unresponsive.

I hope your mom knew that I loved and cared about her although I do regret not getting one last conversation in before she passed. If anything, to let her know she was thought of often.

I will always remember her as being a big part of my life living on West Graham Street. She will be missed.
