Margaret E. "Marge" Nehring age 77 of Dixon passed away on April 8, 2009 in her home. Marge was a graduate of Amboy High School and KSB Hospital School of Nursing. She married her soul mate, Raymond Nehring, on April 16, 1955. Marge spent her nursing career at KSB Hospital, opening the first Inhalation Therapy Department, now known as Respiratory Therapy, and as Supervisor of the Recovery Room. Marge was known as a kind, compassionate nurse, loyal friend, and most importantly as a woman who loved her husband and family above all else. Marge was preceded in death by Raymond, her husband of 51 years, her parents, James and Margaret (Dulen) Mead, a sister, Anna Mary Mead, and a brother Edward Mead. Marge is survived by her children, Theresa (John) Cisneros, Pattie Hummel, James (Letta) Nehring, Anita (Christopher) Daraska, and Joseph (Connie) Nehring. She has 14 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.
