Marilyn S. Roe, age 83, of Dixon, passed into the presence of her Lord, Monday, February 23, 2015, at Heritage Square Health Center in Dixon. She was born on August 14, 1931, the daughter of Fred and Clara (Miller) Stephan, in Danville, IL.

Marilyn worked in education as a teacher at the elementary schools in Danville, IL and Harlam in Loves Park, IL. Marilyn was a master at composition in art, photography and jewelry design. She taught Elementary Arts at the University of North Texas in Denton, TX, Art History at Tulsa University, and Photography at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, OK. She was also a professional photographer and goldsmith and had a photography studio in McLean, IL. She was a member of the Corn Belt Alzheimer's Association Board in Bloomington, IL, Delta Zeta Sorority at Eastern Illinois University, and Daughters of the American Revolution. She will be especially remembered for her loving, gentle and generous heart. Her kind smile would light up the room. She married Dwayne Roe on February 14, 1953, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Danville, IL.

She was preceded in death by her parents.
