Marlene M. Weichman, age 71 of Amboy, died Sunday June 3, 2007 and entered into eternal rest after a long battle with cancer. She graduated from Mennonite Nursing School in 1958 and worked in several areas of nursing including surgery, ER, and clinical practice. She had also been an Avon dealer for 25 years.
