Ronald M. Nolan, age 69 of Amboy, died Sunday April 20, 2008 at KSB Hospital in Dixon. He was born in Peoria, Illinois April 27, 1938 the son of Albert and Frances (Miller) Nolan. He was employed at the Dixon Developmental Center for 18 years, then ESI Gas in Dixon for 8 years, followed by Plano Molding in Mendota until 1995.

He was a member of St. Patrick Catholic Church in Amboy.

He was united in marriage to Juanita McGraw at St. Patrick Church in Amboy November 17, 1979.

He was preceded in death by his parents; 1 brother Arthur Nolan.

He is survived by his wife of Amboy; 2 brothers John (Charlene) Nolan of Marietta, and Russell Nolan of Canton; 3 sisters Alberta (Charles) Kidd of Canton, Patricia (Dennis) Cameron of Edelstein and Marcella Hankins of Kewanee; several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held on Wednesday, April 23, 2008 beginning with a 10:00 AM prayer service in the Mihm-Jones Funeral Home in Amboy followed by a 10:30 AM Mass of Christian Burial at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Amboy with the Rev. Carl Beekman, pastor, officiating. Burial will follow in St. Patrick Cemetery in Amboy. Visitation will be held on Tuesday, April 22, from 4:00 until 8:00 PM with a scripture service at 7:30 PM in the funeral home. A memorial has been established.
