Susie Lucille Hippert, 92, of Franklin Grove passed away Friday, May, 30, 2014 at the Franklin Grove Nursing Center.

Sue was born May 24, 1922 in Galva, the youngest daughter of Frank James and Elizabeth Annamarie (Andres) Hampton. She married Philip Eugene Hippert of Kewanee on December 18, 1942 in Kahoka, Missouri. Sue and Phil travelled the U.S. prior to his deployment to the European Theater during WWII. Stays included Hershey, Pennsylvania and San Antonio, Texas. Sue and Phil moved from Kewanee to the Dixon area in 1949, settling just north of the Green River Ordinance Plant.
