Walter J. Janoskey, age 83, of Dixon, died Tuesday, April 14, 2015, at KSB Hospital in Dixon after a short illness. He was born April 7, 1932, in Chicago, the son of Walter and Sophia (Sudway) Janoskey.

He was a school teacher for the Dixon School District first teaching at Lincoln School then Madison Jr. High prior to his retirement.

He was a member of St. Anne Catholic Church in Dixon.

Walter married Mary T. O'Brien, in Dixon on December 29, 1962. She preceded him in death on January 4, 2007.

Survivors include his three children James Janoskey of London, England; Kathleen (Ryan McCabe) Orlow of Elgin; and Teresa (Toby) Schwarz of Dixon; 7 grandchildren Bethany, Emily, and Christopher Orlow (Kathy's children) and Connor Janoskey, Alexis, Delanie, and Lola Schwarz (Teresa's children); and one brother Edward (Sue) Janoskey of Bridgeman, MI.
